CASE 18-F-0262 - Application of High Bridge Wind, LLC for a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need Pursuant to Article 10 to Construct an Approximately 100 MW Wind Powered Electric Generating Facility Located in the Town of Guilford, Chenango County.

NOTICE OF AVAILABILITY OF INTERVENOR FUNDS  
AND SCHEDULE FOR SUBMITTING FUNDING REQUESTS

(Issued August 14, 2019)

On August 12, 2019, High Bridge Wind LLC (High Bridge Wind), a wholly owned subsidiary of Calpine Corporation, filed an application seeking authority to construct the High Bridge Wind Farm Project (the Project), a wind energy generating facility of up to 100.8 megawatts (MWs), to be located in the Town of Guilford, Chenango County, New York. The Project would consist of up to 25 wind turbines, associated collection lines, access roads, permanent and temporary meteorological towers, a laydown/staging area and an operation and maintenance building. To interconnect the Project with the State's electric system, High Bridge Wind proposes to construct a collection substation, which will include up to five MWs of battery storage, and a point of interconnection (POI) substation that will interconnect with the New York State Electric and Gas 115-kilovolt (kV) transmission line in the Town of Guilford. The collection substation would connect to the POI substation via a less than five-mile span of overhead 115-kV transmission line.

**PLEASE TAKE NOTICE** that funds are available to eligible municipal and local parties to participate in this proceeding (see 16 NYCRR §1000.10 (b)(3); §1000.2 (s)). With its application, High Bridge Wind submitted the required

intervenor fee of \$100,800 to be used to defray expenses for expert witness, consultant, administrative or legal fees (other than in connection with judicial review). At least 50% of the funds must be reserved for potential awards to municipalities. In addition, pursuant to Public Service Law §163(4)(a), any monies remaining in the pre-application intervenor fund account shall also be made available for use at this stage of the proceeding. A notice specifying the amount of such additional monies, if any, will be issued after a final accounting of the pre-application intervenor fund account.
